A Marshall County nonprofit agency is asking for volunteers to help build at least six wheelchair ramps for senior citizens in the Albertville-Boaz area.

"We're in desperate need of men to build wheelchair ramps in the Albertville area," said Terri Shaddox, volunteer coordinator for CASA of Marshall County. "We have five people in Albertville who have been waiting and have been waiting for quite some time. We have one in Boaz."
